**Time Commitment**; Our Trustees currently meet every two months - we alternate between online and in the main office (Kingsland Road, Hackney). Trustees are expected to read through the meeting documents before every meeting and support the CEO or other staff members as and when required.

We work with members of the wider community because young people's lives are interlinked with the people and places where they live, learn and socialise.
